CARF Accreditation

In mid-April Morningside completed a three-day intensive program and administrative review conducted by CARF. This process is completed every 3 years by the international organization which leads to certification required by contracting entities. Morningside has been certified by CARF for more than 30 years and has always received the highest level of certification. Throughout the process Morningside demonstrated how we conform to a series of rigorous and internationally recognized CARF standards. The standards examine everything related to administration as well as our entire employment services program, including in some instances transition services for each of our five locations.



It is an arduous process and Morningside fared well, according to the exit conference conducted by the surveyors. We should receive the final review by the end of May. Once again the surveyors praised our bright, innovative staff that are so very creative in supporting individuals with significant disabilities in finding and maintaining employment.

CEO Retirement

Three years ago Jim Larson, Morningside President/CEO, announced to the board his intention to retire in 2018. A plan was developed at that time for a transition process. That plan has worked well and Jim will retire at the end of July.

Larson, the organization's longest serving President/CEO, joined Morningside as its fourth CEO in 1989. He took over leadership of the nonprofit after a successful 13-year career that included previous CEO roles at similar organizations in McMinnville, Oregon and Ellensburg, Washington.

During his presidency, the organization transformed from a sheltered workshop where individuals with disabilities worked in a segregated setting to an agency that supports individuals working in individual jobs in the community. In 2006 Morningside sold the facility that it constructed on Ethel Street in 1972 and purchased a building on Plum Street where the organization's corporate office is located today. The Thurston County Chamber of Commerce, an active partner with Morningside, purchased the third floor of the building which is named The Business Center. During his career with Morningside the agency experienced geographic expansion as well and now has offices located in Centralia, Grays Harbor, Port Angeles and Tacoma.

"For the past twenty-nine years, it has been both a privilege and an honor to serve alongside teams of dedicated staff focused on finding and supporting hundreds of person with disabilities working in the community." Larson said. "Their creativity and passion for our mission is inspiring."

For his entire career Larson has been a leading proponent of many issues seeking to advance the employment of individuals with disabilities locally, regionally, and nationally. His knowledge, passion for Morningside's mission, and innate sense of fair play has led to the admiration of all who work with and for him. He will be missed. A farewell reception and celebration will be held in his honor in July.

Discovery Zone Grant

Morningside is the recipient of a \$39,500 grant from the Boeing Employees Community Fund to help us equip our new Discovery Zone training facility in Tumwater. The Discovery Zone will feature five focus areas divided into simulated office, retail, grocery, restaurant, and janitorial space; a study area equipped with computers and training software for job seekers to practice skills training and complete resumes and job application forms; and classroom space for training and activities like "Job Club" and "Work and Friendship Club," which provide important networking and community opportunities for our clients. Morningside will also be purchasing assistive technology such as iPad and iPods, vibrating watches and reminders, and training software with ECF funds.

Morningside has long recognized the need for a space dedicated to both job exploration and skill practice for job seekers to explore vocations, learn and practice marketable job skills and soft skills, and identify what kinds of supports they may need to be a successfully employed individual. We are very grateful to the Boeing Employees Community Fund for their support and willingness to help people with disabilities achieve their dreams of employment.
